



## What is Green-e Marketplace?

Green-e Marketplace enables companies to communicate their environmental commitment through the use of the Green-e logo when they have purchased a qualifying amount of Green-e Certified renewable energy. It is administered by the Center for Resource Solutions, a nonprofit based in San Francisco, CA.

Climate change isn't just an environmental problem, it's a business problem. More than 80% of man-made U.S. greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions arise from burning fossil fuels such as coal, oil, and natural gas. Businesses currently account for 50% of U.S. energy consumption. Switching to clean energy significantly reduces energy-related GHG emissions and therefore is an effective business strategy for combating climate change.

## Buying renewable energy is good for the bottom line

Forward-thinking companies that actively address climate change and sustainability have an advantage over their less-progressive peers. They recognize the compelling business reasons for reducing GHG emissions, not just the obvious concern of protecting the natural environment.

Not only are Green-e Marketplace participants leading the way in **avoiding air pollution and greenhouse gas emissions**, they are also **meeting organizational environmental objectives** and **demonstrating civic leadership**. Organizations using the logo cross a wide range of industry sectors including manufacturing, medical services, organic foods, retail and business services, entertainment and professional sports. Companies choose to display the logo on annual reports, displays, marketing collateral, select product packaging and corporate websites to promote their renewable energy use.

Companies who want to use the Green-e logo to communicate their environmental commitment can follow a few simple steps to join Green-e Marketplace (www.green-e.org/marketplace).

- 1) Determine your annual electricity use
- 2) Explore your renewable energy options
- Purchase (or generate) a qualifying amount of Green-e Certified renewable energy
- 4) Complete a Green-e Logo Use Agreement and Renewable Energy Attestation, and submit to determine logo use fee.
- 5) Work with Green-e Marketplace staff to effectively promote your outstanding environmental commitment through use of the nationally recognized symbol for renewable energy excellence.
